










# Reading Prompts

The prompts below can be used to prompt a child when they are stuck on a tricky word. If you try a few prompts and the child still does not get the word, you may simply tell the word to the child.

<p>What would make sense?</p> 	<p>What would sound right?</p> 	<p>What would look right?</p> 
<p>Start again. Reread from the beginning of the sentence.</p> 	<p>Look at the pictures.</p> 	<p>Get your mouth ready to say the first sound.</p> 
<p>Skip the word, read on and then go back.</p> 	<p>Look for little words inside big words.</p> <p><b>standing</b></p>	<p>Say the sounds slowly.. Slide the sounds together.</p>
