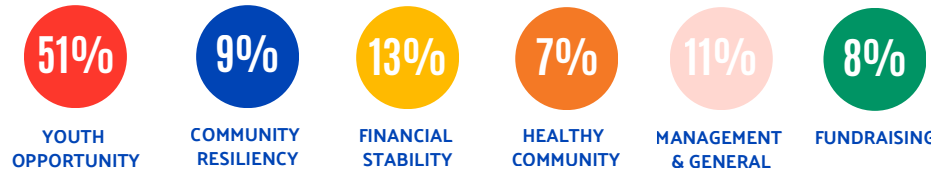

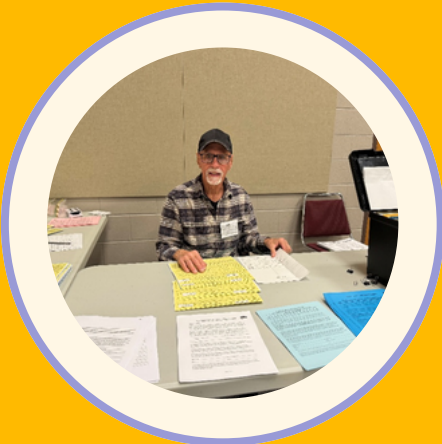
YMCA’s Healthy Eating and Active Living (H.E.A.L.) program

ALICE is an acronym for **A**sset **L**imited, **I**ncome **C**onstrained, **E**mployed, and represents the growing number of families who work hard but still struggle to afford essentials like housing, child care, food, transportation, health care, and technology. These individuals play vital roles in keeping our communities running, yet remain one emergency away from financial crisis.

In 2024, 34% of households in Kenosha County were below the ALICE Threshold, including 11% living in poverty and 23% classified as ALICE. United Way of Kenosha County is proud to support ALICE families by funding programs that meet basic needs and promote long-term financial stability.

We’re building brighter futures by helping kids learn, lead, and thrive. Your support improves reading skills through tutoring, celebrates literacy, inspires a love of books, and empowers young changemakers. Together, we are opening doors of opportunity for youth across our community.

READERS ARE LEADERS 113 students (including pilot summer reading camp program) received literacy support from 91 volunteers. Over 1,200 sessions were provided to students to enhance skills and the joy of reading.

READ ACROSS KENOSHA 212 volunteers read to 4,107 students in 204 classrooms and provided 428 books to each classroom library.

IMAGINATION LIBRARY 650 children enrolled receiving free books monthly.

YOUTH AS RESOURCES Awarded seven youth \$500 each – \$3,500 total invested in youth-led community projects.

BORN LEARNING TRAILS 2 interactive, family-friendly walking paths with activity stations were installed. Helping parents, caregivers, and young children explore, learn, and grow together.

BUILDING OUR FUTURE BOF works to improve educational outcomes in Kenosha County by aligning efforts across sectors. UWKC is proud to support BOF through ongoing community collaboration.

Through Techquity, United Way of Kenosha County is helping ensure that every resident has the technology and digital skills needed to succeed in today’s connected world. As part of a statewide initiative led by United Way of WI, Techquity works to close the digital divide by providing eligible individuals with access to no-cost laptop computers, affordable internet resources, digital skills training, and personalized support from Digital Navigators.
